Looking Unto Jesus (Study Guide To Hebrews)

The epistle to the Hebrews was written to believers who had been Jews. Its purpose is to promote maturity in Christian living.

In matters of the faith, childhood is temporary, adolescence is transistional and it is this Christian maturity to which the Gospel ministry is directed. An apple tree is normal when it is producing fruit; just so with the fruit bearing of the mature Christian.

Many great opportunities for the spread of the Gospel are missed by the contemporary emphasis on childhood and youth. Much is lost as the development and training of the mature Christian is neglected.

It is true, much care must be given to the growth and development of immature Christians. Many of the epistles were written as instruction geared to this aspect of Christian life. However, the plan and purposes of God would fall short of fulfillment if the Christian and his church remained in this immature stage.

It is the mature, fruitful Christian that glorifies God (John 15:8). Therefore, there must be a ministry suited to nourish the mature believer. The epistle to the Hebrews is the classic Scripture specifically for mature believers. The subject does not deal with problems of conduct, discipline, doctrine or error, but a close examination of the believer's personal relationship to the living Lord. "Lo, I come to do *thy will*, O God." Heb. 10:7-9. It is here we persevere until the promises are realized.
